## **Bogus solicitors**

It is a criminal offence for someone to call themselves a <u>solicitor</u> [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/consumers/using-solicitor/legal-jargon-explained#solicitor] or act as a solicitor if they are not on the <u>roll of solicitors [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/consumers/using-solicitor/legal-jargon-explained#roll]</u>. This could be pretending to be a solicitor, for example, at court, but may also include describing themselves as a solicitor on their social media profiles. We call these people 'bogus solicitors' and we may prosecute them. We publish alerts about bogus solicitors [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/consumers/scam-alerts/] and theft or cloning of a genuine solicitor's identity.

All genuine solicitors are on the roll of solicitors, which we administer, and will be able to give you their SRA number on request.

## **Solicitors Register**

You can check whether a law firm is regulated by us using our <u>Solicitors Register [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/consumers/register/]</u>. You can search using the regulated name of a law firm—not its trading name(s). You can also search for a firm by entering its SRA ID number.

## Checking their details

If you think a letter, email or phone call isn't from a solicitor, please check another source such as a website and/or any previous correspondence them. You can also check contact details with us.
