You can only qualify through this route if you meet our <u>transitional</u> <u>requirements [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/legal-practice-course-route/becoming-solicitor-legal-practice-course-transitional-requirements/]</u>.

If you do not meet these, you will need to qualify under the <u>SQE</u> [<u>https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/sqe/]</u>.

A period of recognised training (often known as a training contract) gives individuals supervised experience in legal practice. This is the final stage of the process of qualification as a solicitor where they refine and develop their professional skills they will need to practice.

Trainees can qualify as a solicitor under one of the following set of regulations:

- Trainees that started their period of recognised training on or before 24 November 2019, they need to meet the requirements within the <u>SRA Training Regulations 2014 [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/solicitors/handbook/introAuthPrac/trainingregs2014/]</u>.
- For trainees registered with us since 25 November 2019, it is the <u>Authorisation of Individuals Regulations [https://higher-rights.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/authorisation-individuals-regulations/]</u> and the <u>Education, Training and Assessment Provider</u> <u>Regulations.
