Degree and equivalent qualifications explained

To become a solicitor, you need a degree in any subject, or an equivalent qualifications or experience. Here is what counts as a degree.

UK degrees and other qualifications

- A UK degree awarded at <u>level 6 [https://www.gov.uk/what-different-qualification-levels-mean/list-of-qualification-levels]</u> (or above) by a <u>recognised degree-awarding body [https://www.gov.uk/guidance/recognised-uk-degrees]</u>. This is usually an undergraduate degree but can also be diplomas or other qualifications.
- These equivalent UK qualifications:
 - an accredited qualification at level 6 (or above) of the Framework for Higher Education Qualifications, awarded by recognised degree-awarding body
 - a <u>regulated qualification [https://www.gov.uk/find-a-regulated-qualification]</u> at level 6 (or above) of the Regulated Qualifications Framework (England, Wales and Northern Ireland). This includes CILEX level 6 qualifications
 - an apprenticeship at level 6 or above, approved by the government departments of England, Wales or Northern Ireland
 - a qualification or apprenticeship at level 9 or above of the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework, <u>accredited by the</u> <u>Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA)</u> [http://www.sqa.org.uk/sqa/files_ccc/Guide_to_Scottish Qualifications.pdf] or awarded by a Scottish degree awarding body

Non-UK/overseas degrees and qualification

- A degree shown to be equivalent to either a UK degree/equivalent qualification
- An accredited qualification at level 6 (or above) of the European Qualifications Framework.

Work experience



Work experience equivalent to a UK degree/equivalent qualification can be considered on a case-by-case basis. This would be a sufficient standard of general education and learning (level 3 equivalent of the Regulated Qualifications Framework) and considerable work-based learning.
